

VICARIUS FILII DEI

"The letters inscribed in the Pope's miter are these: Vicarius Filii Dei, which is the Latin for 'Vicar of the Son of God.' Catholics hold that the church, which is a visible society, must have a visible head. Christ, before His ascension into heaven, appointed St. Peter to act as His representative. Upon the death of Peter the man who succeeded to the office of Peter as Bishop of Rome was recognised as head of the church. Hence to the Bishop of Rome, as head of the church, was given the title 'Vicar of Christ.' " (Our Sunday Visitor: April 18, 1915 Catholic).

"In 1335 Bishop Alvarez Pelayo lays down the doctrine that as Christ partook of the nature of God and man, so the Pope is not simply a man but rather a **God on earth**." (Studies in Church History, p.38.)

"The superiority and power of the Roman Pontiff by no means pertain only to heavenly things, to earthly things, and to things under the earth, but are even over angels . . . So that if it were possible that the angels might err . . . they could be judged and excommunicated by the Pope." (Ecclesiastical Dictionary.)

"To pardon a single sin requires all the omnipotence of God . . . but what only God can do by His omnipotence, the priest can also do." (Dignity and Duties of the Priest, Vol. 12, p.34.)

"I never invite an angel down from heaven to hear mass . . . The only person in heaven I ever ask to come down here is Jesus Christ, and I command Him to come down . . . He has to come down every time I say mass, at my bidding Christ must obey." (Western Watchman, January 10, 1915).

"In obedience to the words of his priests . . . God Himself descends on the altar . . . Thus the priest may in a certain manner, be called the creator of his Creator, since . . . he creates, as it were, Jesus in the sacrament." (Dignity and Duties of the Priest, pp.26, 27.)

"Question: Which is the Sabbath day? Answer: Saturday is the Sabbath day. Question: Why do we observe Sunday instead of Saturday? Answer: We observe Sunday instead of Saturday because the Catholic Church, in the council of Laodicea (A.D.336) transferred the solemnity from Saturday to Sunday." "The Church established her own weekly festival... Nor is it true that the apostles changed the Sabbath into Sunday... The Christian Sunday differs widely from the Sabbath of the Law." (The First Age of Christianity, Vol. 2. pp.206,207.)


